Map and directions to the UC WSREC
 (corner of Oakland & Lassen Avenues, Five Points)

Via I-5: south to Coalinga exit. Turn left onto SR 145, proceed for about 5 miles. Make a sharp right turn (east) on Oakland Ave.; go about 6 miles.

Via Highway 99: south to Madera. Take 145 south to Five Points, go south on 269 (Lassen Ave.) 6 miles to Oakland Ave.

Via I-5: north to SR 269 (Huron exit). North on 269 about 20 miles to Oakland Ave.

Via 198 west: north on Lassen Ave. (SR 269) about 8 miles to Oakland Ave.
