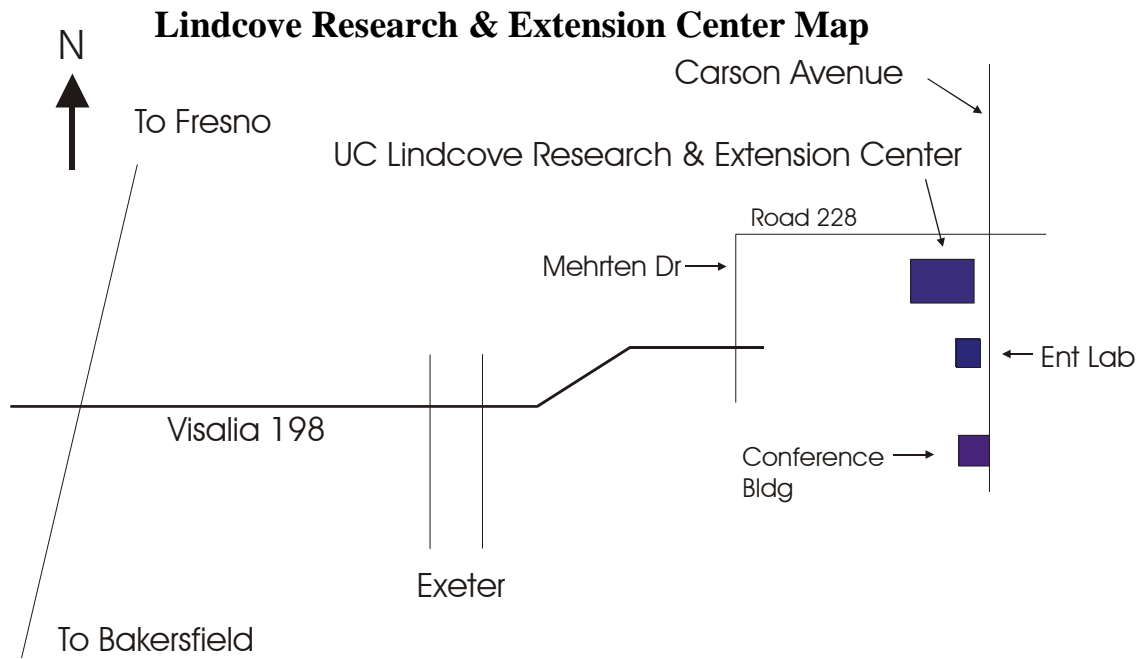

From 99 to 198 East (approx 20-22 miles) Turn LEFT on Mehrten Drive. (There is a sign for the LREC and Mehrten Drive posted on the south/right side of highway).

Follow Mehrten Drive thru its twists. (There is no stop sign). On your RIGHT you will see a chain link fence with a notice for the field station. Make a right hand turn onto Road 228, follow the chain link fence; at the end of the fence is Carson Ave, make another RIGHT.

Follow the entrance to the field station at the RIGHT. Conference facilities are located at the end of Carson on the right.
